

VIRTUE OF THE MONTH: LOVE




God has given us many people in our lives to show us examples of LOVE. Our families,

- **1. A discerning believer** formed in the Catholic Faith community who celebrates the signs and sacred mystery of God's presence through word, sacrament, prayer, forgiveness, reflection and moral living.
- **2. An effective communicator** who speaks, writes and listens honestly and sensitively, responding critically in light of gospel values.
- **3.** A reflective, creative and holistic thinker who solves problems and makes responsible decisions with an informed moral conscience for the common good.
- **4.** A self-directed, responsible, lifelong learner who develops and demonstrates their God-given potential.
- **5.** A collaborative contributor who finds meaning, dignity and vocation in work which respects the rights of all and contributes to the common good.
- **6. A caring family member** who attends to family, school, parish, and the wider community.
- **7. A responsible citizen** who gives witness to Catholic social teaching by promoting peace, justice and the sacredness of human life.

HOLY WEEK AND EASTER

The most important day of our Catholic faith is upon us, Easter. The week leading up to Easter is called The Holy Week, or "Passion Week", and includes Palm Sunday (the day Jesus entered Jerusalem and was celebrated), Maundy Thursday (the "Last Supper" where Jesus met with his disciples to observe Passover), and Good Friday (when Jesus was crucified on the cross). Easter is a time where Jesus, the Son of God, fulfilled prophecy and through his death, has given the gift of eternal life in heaven to those who believe in his death and resurrection.

To honour this important week, we will reflect on and walk through the last days of Jesus' life by reflecting and praying the Stations of the Cross. Our gym will be converted into a prayer space on Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week for classes to go in and pray.





HEALTH AND SAFETY PROTOCOL COVID 19 Positive Cases

If there is a positive case at St. Elizabeth Seton, Peel Public Health will investigate where there is an exposure to COVID-19. As part of its investigation and updated practice, Peel Public Health will direct individuals/classes to self-isolate at home. Steps will be taken as an extra precaution to protect our students. Classroom(s) might be closed until the individual(s) have completed their self-isolation period. Students from these classes will be taught remotely by their classroom teacher until the end of their self-isolation period.

Peel Public Health will contact anyone determined to be a close contact. Only students and staff who are symptomatic or advised by Peel Public Health need to get tested. Staff and students who have not been contacted by Peel Public Health should continue to attend school as usual.

St. Elizabeth Seton will continue to undergo thorough cleaning and sanitizing throughout the school as part of our daily enhanced cleaning protocol.

Note: If you or your child(ren) have tested positive, please inform the school so appropriate protocol is followed thereafter.

MASKS

All students in JK to Grade 8 are required to wear a mask at school. Please send your child with a mask everyday. We highly recommend sending your child to

school with more than one mask each day in the case the mask becomes soiled. Masks must be worn at all times of the day except for when students are eating snacks and lunches.

SELF-SCREENING PROCEDURES

All staff and students must self-screen every day before attending school. If a student or staff member is experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19, they must stay home from school and should seek testing and appropriate medical attention.

Parents/Guardians are expected to screen their child(ren) daily for any symptoms of cold, flu, or other symptoms associated with COVID-19 using the Self-Assessment tool developed by the Province of Ontario. Health care professionals are not located within our schools, so staff will not be screening students. However, if staff observes a child that is ill, parents/quardian will be called to pick them up from school promptly as well as their siblings. This being said, if you work far from the school or you are unable to pick your child(ren) up, please provide the school with a contact person should your child show signs or symptoms.

Any staff or student who develops COVID-19 symptoms while in school will be immediately separated from others in a separate room until they go home.

HAND SANITIZER

Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the school for use, as well hand sanitizer will be placed in all classrooms that do not have a sink and hand soap.

VENTILATION

The transmissibility of COVID-19 is known to be influenced by environmental conditions and airflow. In this regard, the

DPCDSB is following the guidance of the Ministry and the local public health authorities with respect to the operation of HVAC systems and ventilation in schools to support a safe and healthy environment for all. Over the course of the summer, the condition of all HVAC units was assessed and any necessary maintenance (including filter changes) was undertaken to ensure our school is safe.

CLASSROOM SETUP

Students will remain in the same seat in their class as much as possible. This area will become the student's personal space and will be located as far as possible from other students. Where possible, students will remain with the same teacher with minimized rotation. Classroom design will vary from teacher to teacher, but the goal remains to keep everyone at least 1-metre apart. All nonessential furniture and/or large items have been removed from classrooms in order to maximize the space for physical distancing. All student belongings are kept in their personal area. The same desk will be used by the student each day.

ENTRY AND DISMISSAL

School entry times and dismissal times are staggered and multiple entry and exit doors are used to allow for physical distancing. Students and staff are required to sanitize their hands as they enter the school and prior to dismissal. All students are expected to meet parents and/or older siblings on the sidewalks/pathways to go home. No one is to walk through the school yard. We want parents to feel welcome in the school but with COVID-19 protocols in place, parents and older siblings should not gather in the school yard and are asked to maintain safe physical distances at all times. Pets are not permitted on the school grounds or near entrances and exit ways as many students have allergies and are uncomfortable around

unfamiliar animals. We are also asking that students who walk home are respectful of our neighbours.

WASHROOM

Signage is placed inside the washrooms, reminding students of both physical distancing and proper hygiene. Washrooms will be cleaned throughout the school day and again each evening. Signage will be placed outside of the washrooms identifying the maximum number of occupants at any given time. The middle washroom stalls will not be in use to maximize social distancing. Identification marks on the floor have been placed to provide a visual to students about the appropriate place to stand at the sink to allow for social distancing to the hand dryer

STUDENT ABSENCE AND ARRIVAL TIME



We ask that parents continue to call to notify the school if their child will be absent and/or late. Your phone call to the school saves us time

trying to ensure your child is safe. Remember that you can call the school twenty-four hours a day to report your child's absence at (905) 821-2277 Upon reaching the school answering service please leave the following information: a) Date of absence b)Student's full name c) Grade level and teacher d) Reason for absence e) Date of return.

STORAGE AND ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION

Parents are responsible for ensuring that all medication and forms are updated annually for any student who requires medication to be administered at school. If your child requires medication please have the necessary forms completed and return them, along with any medication, to the office as soon as possible. Forms are available at the school office.

CUSTODY OF CHILDREN

On rare occasions, we are faced with difficult situations in which non-custodial parents arrive at school asking to visit their child or to take their child home after school. We are best able to serve and protect students when we are made aware of legal custody arrangements, visitation rights and other special instructions. If legal custody matters affect your family, please ensure that our office and classroom teachers are aware of any custodial arrangements that may affect your child during school hours.

VISITORS TO OUR SCHOOL

Parents/guardians are asked to book an appointment if you need to come into the school building. Please take the Covid 19 self-assessment mandated by the health ministry before you come

Please do not make specific requests for teachers as staffing is always tentative and changes can occur up until the second week of September when staffing is finalized.
