

Truth and Reconciliation

In 1973 six-year-old Phyllis Webstad was gifted a brand new orange shirt from her grandmother and wore it to the residential (mission) school she attended in British Columbia. Upon her arrival, school officials removed and discarded the shirt from her and replaced it with a school uniform. This greatly affected the mental and emotional well-being of Webstad and symbolized that "her feelings never mattered." September 30 was chosen as the date to commemorate all the children that attended residential schools as it was also the time of year that children had to leave their homes and communities to attend the schools. This annual campaign began in 2013 after Webstad shared this experience at a reunion with other survivors. As a school community we came together in solidarity on Friday September 27th to acknowledge "Every Child Matters"


am and 8:45 am to begin their learning promptly at 8:45 AM. Being punctual is a great virtue. We appreciate your support in this matter.

Parking Lot Safety/Kiss and Ride



As always, student safety is a priority at St. Elizabeth Seton School. Please continue to use the available parking spaces or park in the designated areas on the street when picking up or dropping off your child. The Mississauga Parking Enforcement will issue tickets for those who are illegally parked. The Kiss n Ride should be constantly moving to prevent a back log of traffic. Children should not be walking across the parking lot unattended in front of cars. Please do not leave your vehicle unattended in the Kiss and Ride.

If a change needs to occur, we would appreciate you sending a note to your child's teacher on (or before) the day of the change. The school will not honour request made by phone to change pick-up arrangements on the same day as there is no way to identify the caller. Thank you to everyone who are using the Kiss and Ride safely. We are asking for everyone's patience and cooperation to ensure that all our students arrive and leave school safely.

Student Information

It is important that we have up to date records of your address, phone numbers, and emergency contacts in the event that the school must contact you regarding your child. Please inform the office or your child's teacher if any information changes throughout the year.

Front Door Monitor System

For visitors and parents to our school, in order to assist you better, please stand facing the camera and ring the bell once. Please wait for a response.... remember, schools are busy places! For the safety of our students, we ask that you always state the reason for your visit.

We also ask for your patience and understanding as the door will not be answered during morning prayers and the Canadian National Anthem. Often our school secretary is away from her desk. Messages calling in the office cannot be guaranteed to be picked up the same day. Classes will not be interrupted to pass messages onto student. Notes in agendas and communication bags are very helpful for both staff and parents. Thank you for your cooperation and support!

Storage and Administration of Medication

Parents are responsible for ensuring that all medication and forms are updated annually for any student who requires medication to be administered at school. If your child requires medication, please have the necessary forms completed and return them, along with any medication, to the office as soon as possible. Forms are available at the school office.



Medical Alert-Anaphylactic shock- Nut Allergies

Please be aware that there are students in our school with a severe life-threatening food allergy (anaphylaxis) to NUTS and PEANUTS. This is a medical condition that causes a severe reaction to certain allergens and can result in death within minutes. Although this may or may not affect your child's class directly, please send lunches and snacks to school with your children that are free from peanuts or nut products. **This includes Wow butter and Nutella.** We ask that you do not send in food products for the whole class to celebrate birthdays or social occasions. A donation of a book or game to the classroom is a safe alternative to food products and will be enjoyed so much longer by the children. Please feel free to contact your child's teacher if you have any concerns or questions. We thank you for your co-operation and attention to this health watch.

Custody of Children

On rare occasions, we are faced with difficult situations in which non-custodial parents arrive at school asking to visit their child or to take their child home after school. We are best able to serve and protect students when we are made aware of legal custody arrangements, visitation rights and other special instructions. If legal custody matters affect your family, please ensure that our office and classroom teachers are aware of any custodial arrangements that may affect your child during school hours.

Parents/guardians are asked to book an appointment if you need to come into the school building.

Guidelines for Halloween Costumes

All students are encouraged to dress up for Halloween which we will celebrate on October 28th. As we are a Catholic school, we ask that you use your best judgment in creating and wearing costumes for this special event. **Costumes**

mocking/stereotyping a culture, depicting violence and death are not appropriate.

Students should be comfortable and able to sit in their costume for the day. We ask that students **DO NOT WEAR OR BRING HALLOWEEN MASKS to school** as they limit vision and can be quite hot to wear. **Hooks, swords, toy guns, spears and similar weapons or objects are also not to come to school.** Save them for the evening when the children are trick or treating. In keeping with **Sabrina's Law** (schools are mandated to manage student allergies), **do not send food (candy treats, baked goods, doughnuts etc...)** for your child's class to eat.





Emergency Procedures

In accordance with Ministry regulations, we will conduct three fire drills this Fall. Our 1st fire drill was held on Friday September 27th. All our students, including our youngest FDK's followed all safety measures that resulted in a successful drill. In addition, we will also practice lockdown procedures before scheduling a drill. This procedure is intended to prepare students should a high-risk incident occur on school property or in the near vicinity.

Daily Dismissal of Students

Students are dismissed at 3:15 p.m. All students are expected to meet parents and/or older siblings *on the sidewalks/pathways to go home*. No one is to walk through the school yard. We want parents to feel welcome in the school nonetheless we request to not gather in the school yard and maintain safe physical distances at all times. Pets are not permitted on the school grounds or near entrances and exit ways as many students have allergies and are uncomfortable around unfamiliar animals. We are also asking that students who walk home are respectful of our neighbours.



Eco School News

Again, this school year we will work towards Eco-School certification. We are asking that all students use refillable water bottles, lunch boxes free of wrappers, their own spoon/fork. The school no longer provides

plastic cutlery for students as part of our reducing plastic usage at school.

CCAT testing for Grade 4 Students

The results of the test are used to help to identify students who may be eligible for enhanced/gifted programming in the future.

In accordance with school board policies, all volunteers having direct and regular contact with students are required to provide a Criminal Reference Check. There is no fee for volunteers wishing to have a Criminal Reference Check. Each year, volunteers must also sign a Annual Offense Declaration form. Please note as per above, we are required to officially notify parent / guardian of the Accident, including, IF NOT of serious nature. Specially, if the injury is a Head injury.

The Office / Admin will assess the situation and based on the protocol will follow the guidelines and First Aid will be provided.

Also, an Official call to the parent / guardian will be made to notify the same and follow procedure.


