Joy or the "Shepherd's Candle"

Dec. 22nd - Fourth Sunday of Advent: purple candle representing

Peace also called the "Angel's Candle"

PLASP Child Care Services is now accepting registrations for their before and after school programs, including programs at this school. We encourage you to register as soon as possible. Available space is allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

PLASP programs are licensed by the Ministry of Education and are adhering to strict public health guidelines. *Highly trained staff facilitate fun, age-appropriate activities both indoors and outdoors.*

Before School programs operate from 7:30 a.m. until school starts and include breakfast daily. After School programs begin at school dismissal, include a substantial daily snack, and run until 6:00 p.m.

Cold and Flu Season

Parents are gently reminded to please keep your child at home if they are ill.

A child who is coughing, wheezing, etc. is not in a state to learn and will only affect the health of others. As well, please understand that if your child is well enough to attend school, they should be well enough to go outside at recess. (It is impossible for supervision and safety of the students to have some students inside and others outside).

On extremely cold days, when the wind-chill equivalent temperature is minus 25 degrees Celsius or lower, students will stay inside as per Board guidelines.

As the temperature drops, students need to dress appropriately for the weather. Mittens, scarves, boots and other winter attire should be worn to school.

National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women

Bullying Prevention-Keeping SAFE at Seton





STEP 4: Respond to Placement Results



Playground Rules and Behaviour

Playground games and activities are to promote positive and safe social interaction and must follow school and Dufferin Peel School Board Code of Conduct. Rules and expectations apply at all times that students are on the playground. Teacher supervision is provided before and after school and at all recesses. Students are required to stay within the designated school playground boundaries and follow the three simple rules:



- 1. Hands to yourself
- 2. Feet on the ground
- 3. Watch what you say and how you say it!
 - * Ball games and running activities are allowed on the grass area/Field only.
 - Stay off the field if not playing ball games.
 - * The only ball games allowed on the paved/tarmac area are foursquare and basketball.
 - * Students need to come prepared with appropriate seasonal outerwear- boots & snowpants in the winter, with a change of footwear for indoors.
 - * Students line up, enter and exit through their designated entry/exit grade doors at all times.
 - * Throwing snowballs, stones etc. is not permitted.
 - In the case of a pavement only/tarmac recess, students are required to stay on the tarmac and off the field.

 This is to be a WALK and TALK recess. NO EQUIPMENT IS ALLOWED.

It's Kindergarten Registration time!



The following documents are required for registration:

- proof of age of the child (birth certificate or passport);
- original Roman Catholic baptismal certificate
 - an original Roman Catholic baptismal certificate (for child and/or parent/guardian), or;
 - an original baptismal certificate (for child and/or parent/guardian) from a church that is in full communion with the Holy See of Rome, or;
 - an original baptismal certificate (for child and/or parent/guardian) from an Eastern/Byzantine Rite of the Roman Catholic Church.
- proof of Canadian citizenship (birth certificate/passport) or permanent resident status;

- proof of home address (two of the following: property tax bill, current utility bill, real estate document or Government of Canada issued forms);
- emergency rural address numbers, if applicable;
- immunization report your child's immunizations to Region of Peel Public Health or Wellington-Dufferin-Guelph Public Health online and give the reference number to your child's school when registering.
- proof of English Separate School Support (may be provided at the time of registration by completing an Application for the Direction of School Support and/or a Separate School Lease Agreement available at the school). *All documentation must be in English.






News from our Library

Ms. Pereira wishes you all happy reading and I look forward to seeing you at our next book fair in February!


